What is your FOCUS for continuous improvement?

In Oakland, we know we are defining our "Big Rocks", or our focus of improvement as part of the Site Planning process. In most cases schools select at least two academic and one school culture focus area. These priority focus areas are identified by school communities through a process of looking at data, reviewing their program, and assessing their resources, and developing plans.

Why is FOCUS so important for Priority, Focus, and AMO schools?

The improvement strategies of Pairing schools and engaging Communities of Practice center around schools working together to improve student performance. In the absence of a FOCUS, that work becomes confusing, muddled, and less and less helpful. It can become more work than it's worth. On the contrary, when a school has a clear FOCUS for their improvement efforts, Pairing and Communities of Practice can provide an awesome support structure for school improvement.
